In his report to Grand Secretary, Brother Noshir Godrej Paghdiwalla describes how the situation is much worse than the media have been reporting. We offer our prayers and support to the Brethren in all of our 29 Lodges in India.

In Memory of

Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh 1921-2021

Prince Philip was initiated into Freemasonry on 5th December 1952. He had two very prominent Brethren as his proposer and seconder into the Navy Lodge No 2612 in London. His proposer was Rear Admiral Sir Arthur Hall, KBE, CB, PGD, a previous Worshipful Deputy Master of Navy Lodge and Honorary member of United Service Lodge. His seconder was Admiral of the Fleet, Baron Fraser of North Cape.

He remained a member of the Lodge and was recognised in 2002 as a 50-year Mason.

Sir Alexander Fleming. Forever associated with the discovery of penicillin, was an ardent freemason. Initiated into Santa Maria Lodge, 2682, London, on 9th November 1909, he became Master in 1924. He also joined the London Scottish Rifles Lodge in 1911. In 1925 he joined Misericordia Lodge, 3286, London, becoming Master of this Lodge in 1935. In 1942, he was elected Senior Grand Deacon of the United Grand Lodge of England and became Past Grand Warden in 1948. Although not a member of a Scottish Lodge, he was promoted to the Thirtieth Degree. He died in 1955.

At the Zoom meetings we had in February, March, and April, we were treated to very fine Lectures by Brothers Brian Crawford, Peter Foster Snr and Michael Scott Turner.

February 9th

After the Business was completed, Brother Brian Crawford spoke on the about the "The Boys Brigade". His talk was broken up into 5 parts.

- 1. Brief History of The Boys' Brigade.
- 2. Background of Bro Brian Crawford.
- 3. The B.B and Masonic Links.
- 4. B.B Major Events.
- 5. Personal reflections and Memories.

Brian's parting shot was - my thanks for listening to me and I trust and hope that tonight you have enjoyed my story of The Boys' Brigade and that it has thrown some light on the subject showing the Church and Masonic intertwined.

The Master thanked Brian for his talk, which lasted some twenty-five minutes, followed by another twenty-five minutes of questions from the Brethren all of whom thoroughly enjoyed the evening.

March 9th

After the Business was completed, the talk was given by Brother Peter Foster Snr, PM, Robertson's Lodge who spoke about "The Brahan Seer".

Most of what we know about the Brahan Seer comes from the oral tradition of the Gael. According to one source Kenneth MacKenzie (also known as Coinneach Odhar–dun coloured Kenneth) was born in Baile na Gille in Uig on the Isle of Lewis round about 1650.

He lived at Loch Ussie near Dingwall in Ross-shire and worked as a labourer from about 1675 on the Brahan Estate, seat of the Seaforth chiefs.

The first literary reference to him comes in Pennant's "A Tour in Scotland (1769)" in which it was stated – "Every country has its prophets and the Highlands their Kenneth Odhar".

The only historical reference so far uncovered exists in the form of two Commissions of Justice ordering the authorities to prosecute a certain Keanoch Owir for witchcraft—this in 1577, so the reference places him 100 years before the traditional tales (and the time of the 3rd Earl of Seaforth) so cannot be attributed to the same man. This is one of many.

Of his many predictions, handed down by word of mouth, some remain unfulfilled, others doubtfully or partly so. Some however have come to pass wholly and convincingly. The Master thanked Peter for his talk, which lasted some twenty minutes.

Under normal circumstances, this meeting in the Calendar Year, would have been our Annual Visitation from Provincial Grand Lodge. With the Provincial Grand Lodge conducting virtual meetings, the Master symbolically presented the Maul to the Provincial Grand Master, Brother Robin Charles Cattanach, with the words – "It is my honour and pleasure, on behalf of the Brethren of Lodge Fingal,

to hand you the Maul on this Zoom Meeting tonight, as a token of Fealty and Allegiance to Provincial Grand Lodge and through you to the Grand Lodge of Scotland.

The PGM then went on to give his thoughts about the minute given by the PG Secretary and congratulated the Administrative Team, for the handling of the Lodge Business during these times we find ourselves in. The Zoom meeting was then handed back.

April 13th

After the Business was completed, the Master introduced Brother Mike Turner, Provincial Grand Secretary to speak about 'My Friend'.

'My Friend' had no formal education, but was extraordinarily inquisitive, observant, and, may I say it, intelligent. He was extremely instrumental in the development of scientific knowledge. He was foremost in one of the most dramatic and future-influencing political events in history. He was prominent as a guiding light in furthering freemasonry.

My Friend whom I want you to meet is Benjamin Franklin. Benjamin was born on 17 January 1706. His birthplace was Milk Street Boston. (A brief description of life in the mid-18th Century followed). Mike's parting shot was Brethren, I hope I have effectively introduced you to my friend, Benjamin Franklin, a scientist, a politician, an inventor, a businessman, a Freemason. I'd like to leave you with a few more of Benjamin's quotes:

Without freedom of thought, there can be no such thing as wisdom, and no such thing as Liberty without freedom of speech.

Democracy is two wolves and a lamb voting on what to have for lunch. Liberty is a well-armed lamb contesting the vote!

Fish and visitors both began to smell after three days.

The Master thanked Mike for his talk, which lasted some thirty-five minutes.

As we go through these strange times. Take care and stay safe.

They do not receive any funding and rely on donations and their own fundraising activities. This has been severely restricted because of the Covid pandemic. This was to be a joint venture between Lodge Averon 866 and the Provincial Grand Lodge of Ross and Cromarty. My thanks to Bro Mike Turner PGL Secretary who emailed the fundraiser to all Provinces in Scotland. I decided to run the fundraiser for two weeks.

This was awfully close to my heart after a head injury at work many years ago left me with severe bouts of depression and several inpatient admissions to hospital.

I was humbled by the generosity of the Masonic fraternity. I received donations from as far afield as John O'Groats to the Borders, west to Stornoway and east from Fife. I received some fantastic letters of support along with their donations from Brethren and Lodge Secretaries, most of whom I had never met. When the fund ended it stood at £3,042.50 and this was presented to Mikeysline by myself and the RWPGM, but since then I have been delighted to receive a cheque for £50 from 2 PGL members in the borders and a pledge of £500 from the PGL of Caithness and their Lodges, which brings the total to £3,592.50 a sum I did not think possible at the start.

The Tapestry was won by Lodge Old Inverness Kilwinning St John V1 and I was delighted to present Bro Alex Craib PM and Bro John Russel with their prize.

My sincere thanks to all who helped make this fundraiser the success it ended up being. The managers at Mikeysline have asked me to pass on their thanks to all who donated.

Not much to report this month except the sad passing to the Grand Lodge Above of two of our Brethren. Brother Barry Gray who I didn't know and was a regular attender before moving away for work but still sent donations to the Lodge.

Oftentimes I have seen on Facebook the good works the Craft has done and the people who have genuinely been helped. The amount of money raised during Covid is astounding, but its only really mentioned in CLOSED Facebook Groups, which you have to be a member of in order to view the "posts".

Given that we sometimes receive bad press (or no press) and our membership in some areas is aging, we need to think seriously about Marketing and Public Relations. After discussing this with a few Brethren, I think Social Media could be a platform for open statements of what, as Freemasons, we do within the community and what we get from being in the Craft.

There are two caveats though ... First, we should not be publishing anything that does not adhere to the high moral values that as Freemasons we aspire. Secondly the issue of comments. As an open group on Facebook for example, we need to curate and sadly, censor any trolling. On Facebook you can turn off commenting, however this means you cannot gather information from people who are not in the Craft, or Brethren; we may be missing some good ideas. Perhaps a group to which anyone can join or a moderator?

Another option is the website. Information can be posted on a news page and the URL distributed to the Press. For example, Bro. George Robinson and his "magic carpet". would make a great story. £3092.50 to Mikeysline - Well done George! We need to be aware though that news needs to be regular and not repetitive and with an image. Pretty much like the Provincial Patter.

Please let me (Ron: <u>sales@lochalsh.com</u>) know what you think and any ideas you have about transparency, marketing and where and how to promote the Craft.

Donations to Charity


